inaugural service of the
new chapel hall at
Nagaland House, Basement hall,
R.K. Puram, Sector 12, New Delhi on
14 July 2019, Sunday. This marks a
shift from the old location at BM
Ganges Senior Secondary School,
Civil Lines where the church was
running for 11 years since 2008.
Prior to that, NCF Delhi used to
conduct its services at the erstwhile
Nagaland House at R.K. Puram before
it was taken down for renovation.

The first service at the new location was attended by over 300 congregation members, including various Naga fellowships based in Delhi. Miss Asha Sanchu, who runs 'Miqlat' – a ministry for vulnerable/disadvantaged women of the Naga society – greeted the congregation and spoke briefly about the ministry updates.

Mrs. Meneu Chandola, a longstanding member of NCF Delhi, gave the welcome remarks on behalf of the church. A short history of the church was given by the Pastor, Rev. Dr. Noulezhalie Ricky Medom. Having begun his ministry in Delhi in 1992 with his wife Mrs. Virginia Dela Rosa Medom, 2019 marked their 27 years of faithful service in the capital city, for which they were felicitated by the church members.

Rev. Dr. Zelhou Keyho, General Secretary, NBCC, blessed the service as the guest speaker. He spoke on how the people represent the church, and not the infrastructure in itself. He reminded us about our life purpose—God has placed us wherever we are and we must build lives as the Lord has built us. Referencing to *Acts 2:46*, he urged us to commune regularly with God and with fellow believers.

The church's history bears witness to the blessings of God showered so generously upon its members, and this is further testified by the success of the inaugural programme. Special gratitude goes to all who were involved in the construction of the new hall, relocation of the church and the conduct of the inaugural service.

PARENTS PAGE UNFAILING LOVE: JOURNEYING TOGETHER AS MEN AND WOMEN

welve of us gathered at the residence of Rev. Dr. N Ricky Medom
(Pastor Naga Christian Fellowship, Delhi) and Mrs. Viring Medom on 2nd
October 2019 for married couples' seminar with Mr. Jonathan and Mrs. Thelma
Nambu from the Philippines as facilitators/resource persons. The seminar was
titled "Unfailing Love: Journeying together as men and women." This came at an
opportune time to refresh and recapture our collective calling as a couple raising a family
in the capital city.

Mr. Jonathan started the seminar by affirming the overarching message for everyone that the God of the Bible not only created human beings in His image, but also pursues each one of us in our brokenness to have deeper fellowship with Him to realize our full potential. The facilitators took turns to share on three important areas to be considered by every couple to have deeper and meaningful relationship:

- 1. Created nature: In the natural created order, there exist certain behavioral differences `between men and women. We watched a short video, on how neuroscience tries to explain why men and women think, feel, choose, communicate or respond to situations differently through some fascinating anatomical differences of the brain structure responsible for those actions. We look at why men tend to compartmentalize while women tend to think more web-like. Why men tend to be more silent after a day's work to process while women like to talk through it...etc. On one hand, understanding these basic differences can be beneficial, as it allows one to appreciate better why the others behave in certain ways. On the other hand, we should avoid making excuses or blame one's actions or behavior on a physical created nature.
- 2. Fallen nature: We were reminded that all the complex behavior of an individual cannot be explained through the light of the natural created order. We need to consider the fallen nature of human beings as portrayed in the book of Genesis. To the question, where was Adam when the Serpent tempted Eve? On closer reading of Genesis 3:6, we found that Adam was with Eve when the whole event transpired. However, there was complete silence on the

- part of Adam, who was the recipient of God's command. The result of the fall is exhibited by both men and women in the form of distorted images of masculinity and femininity. As individuals, we enter into a relationship with different backgrounds, knowledge, habits, or upbringing which requires redirection.
- 3. Redeemed nature: To truly live out the full potential of our calling, we need to live as redeemed men and women as demonstrated and described in the book of Ephesians 5:21-33 which calls for sacrificial love. As men, we were challenged to 'move' our family and realign with God's bigger vision and not be silent whenever called for a response. For women, to 'trust' in the faithful leading. During discussion, we were encouraged to learn that our individual family struggles were not unique; in fact, they were common for the couples/families. The openness and humility with which the facilitators shared important life lessons in overcoming difficult circumstances through the grace of God in their own journey of faith were uplifting. The seminar was concluded by offering prayers for each other, and we departed hoping to meet again.

WOMEN OF FAITH

ince 1992 till date, NCFD focus has been on discipleship through regular, weekly Bible studies among couples, single and married ladies, students and professionals. Over the years we have many ladies and mothers who have joined these Bible study groups and are reaching out. *Titus 2:3-5* instructs women to teach other women and encourage them to be strong in the faith.

We have been richly blessed with women who have come alongside in ministry since the nascent stage of NCFD. We affirm the enormous contribution women have made in the early days of the church. Our women have been supportive, responsive and active participants in heading the children's ministry, directing the

Women's ministry is a vital part of NCF Delhi ministry. We strive to make NCF a place where women in the congregation grow closer to the community and to the church.



The theme song for the camp was composed by our talented brother Atsen Murry, an ex-Tyrannian. We left for Sattal on the night of 22nd September. The campers were divided into 4 groups and the names were based on the synonyms of 'Unfailing love'. They were: Boundless, Unceasing, Enduring and Everlasting.

Boundless group was the winner of the skit competition; Everlasting group for the theme song competition; Unceasing group for memory verse recitation. The group Enduring emerged as the overall winner.

"Christian camps spark the beginning of faith for many. Perhaps it's traveling to a new place or hearing faith talked about through songs not heard before and in ways one hadn't imagined. Another grace of the camp is, of course, the fresh air, in several senses, liberating the campers from the lure of the digital screen" and simply basking in the lushness and breathing in the pristine air of the mountains that show the fullness of God in the creation. This certainly allowed the campers to refocus their minds and discover God afresh.

Due care was placed on our spiritual growth and knowledge through morning devotions, sessions and counselling. The morning devotions were led by Uncle Ricky. We reflected and meditated on the passages from Psalms. Each group had two representatives to share the outstanding thoughts and application of the Bible passage given to us each morning.

The evening sessions included the Scripture memorisation program, which was led by Aunty Viring. Getting ourselves repeatedly familiar with the Word of God for over a week proved valuable in letting the Word dwell richly in the life of the campers.

The sessions conducted by Uncle Jonathan and Aunty Thelma centered on

Uncle Jay Orvis stressed on the importance of being firm in our faith, making sure that we do not get lost in the way but strive to reach the Promised Land like Caleb and Joshua did. He encouraged us to know our Bible thoroughly and to let others see Jesus in us.

The campers bonded over group discussions, group dynamics and other various competitions. The camp came to an end on the fourth day, the 26th of September, after a round of sharing and prayers.
