atrick "Pat" Gelsinger is the
Director & CEO of a \$4.6 billion
hardware Technology company
in Silicon Valley, California, USA.
Gelsinger grew up in a Church
going family in rural America but it was
only after he went to Silicon Valley that
his faith became very real. And since
then he has become a man who takes
seriously what the Bible says and is

committed to following Christ on a daily basis. He also 'puts his money where his mouth is' by giving away almost 50% of his \$14 million/year salary to Church missions & charities, a promise he and his wife had made early in his career. Listen to what he says:

"I believe we all work for God, not for a boss or for the president of the *company. My highest priority is my* daily time with God. I make time to pray wherever I may be. When I travel, *I have my prayer time on the way to* the airport. It's a 45 minute drive and I start by singing a few hymns and then pray through the ACTS acronym (acknowledgment, confession, thanksgiving, supplication), which is a popular form of prayer... I also live as a clear witness to my faith. I'm out of the closet and identify myself clearly as a Christian. When someone asks me "why aren't you golfing on Sundays?" I don't deflect the question. I say, 'I've decided to prioritise my relationship with God and I'm committed to being in church." - Pat Gelsinger, CEO VMware.

We must realize that all of life relates to God and there is no such thing as Sacred and Secular. We are all called to serve our Lord full time whether in sacred or secular vocation. We often divide our lives into two disconnected parts where God is in one spiritual dimension, the sacred, and our work is on another dimension, the secular. We create compartments in our life and confine God in one corner and then think we can do whatever we like without God in the other compartments.

This worldview leaves God out of the most important aspects of our lives, the so called Secular where in fact we are told to be Salt and Light in this world, full of decay and corruption. This is sad and tragic because God calls us Christians to make Him the centre of our lives. He wants us to involve Him in every aspect of our life and wherever it is that we are placed.

We are called to different vocations to do that. And it is wrong to think there are sacred, Godly things we do and there are secular worldly things we do.

SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

It all boils down to what is in our hearts. We can be working in what looks like sacred vocation as a Pastor, Evangelist, Missionary, etc. with a dark, self-centered, unforgiving spirit. Or you can engage at a 'secular' job in an environment where conversations are littered with profanity, where jealousy, envy leads to wearisome intrigues and politics and yet like Daniel or Joseph maintain a reputation beyond reproach. You can bring honour and

glory to God in a very worldly secular environment.

To make the most of our job and be happy in our work is a gift God wants to give us. Being happy in our work doesn't depend on the work, it depends on our attitude. God has created everything beautiful and so we should value them. The natural world that God created is as real as the Spiritual world that we look forward to enter into one day. So to think

that the vocational full time Christian service (Sacred) is more important than physical, secular work is definitely not a biblically sound doctrine. God sees everything we do and He appreciates it and will reward us regardless of the type of work we do. Our whole mindset will change when we realize that even the most menial work is done as we do it as a labour of love and worship for Jesus!

Q. Most times we desire the blessings and not the Blesser. Can you relate to that with personal experiences?

God loves us and wants to bless us, but He does it in His own way- according to His will and in His time - not ours. Many a times, we seek God only to get things from Him instead of simply wanting a relationship from Him. It is not wrong to seek help, healing or blessings from God. In Matthew 7:11 we read "If you, then, though you are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father in heaven give good gifts to those who ask Him?" God receives glory when He does for us what we cannot do for ourselves. But when we focus on the blessings, we want God

to give us more than we focus on God himself, the blessings we're hoping for become like idols in our life, drawing our attention away from God and toward our own desires.

"Seeking God Himself rather than His blessings" — I learnt this principle at a very young age in my life. Growing up in a family of believing parents, I was always taught to seek God and His will in every aspect of my life. When I was finishing my high school, I was faced with making one of the most difficult decisions. I had to decide which career to pursue. As any young teenager, I had so many desires and aspirations but my parents always taught me to pray and seek God's will and not just provide God with my list of requirements; expecting Him to fulfill them all. One morning, while I was praying, I heard a voice telling me "You are going to be a missionary doctor." Startled, I opened my eyes only to find myself alone with no one else in the room.

I heard this voice two more times and then there was silence. I was surprised as well as disturbed as this was nowhere on my list. I cried to the Lord and told Him that I was willing to obey if this was really His voice and asked for a confirmation, and the Lord graciously did confirm it to me through a dream He revealed to my mother. Through this experience, the Lord taught me that if I really wanted to seek Him and His kingdom and not just material blessings from Him, I needed to obey Him wholeheartedly and allow His Lordship over my life.

This was the beginning in my journey of seeking God and His will for me rather

than just the desire for His blessings. Over the years, I realized that seeking God and His will enables us to love Him unconditionally in contrast to loving Him only when we receive something good from Him. Shadrach, Meshach and Abednego; exiles in a foreign land, refused to worship the Golden image EVEN IF their God did not save them from the fiery furnace. Also, receiving blessings FROM God may lead to temporary contentment, but receiving God Himself IN our lives leads to an eternal transformation. Out of the ten lepers who came to receive healing, nine came only to get a blessing but the tenth met the Blesser and went back a changed person.

Actually, we need not waste our time and efforts in seeking blessings from God if we follow a simple two-point formula given in the scripture:

- Seek FIRST His kingdom and His righteousness; "and all these things shall be added to you." Matthew 6:33.
- Delight yourself IN the Lord; "And He will give you the desires of your heart," Psalm 37:4. So, receiving blessings from God is a by-product of seeking Him and delighting in Him.

Today, wherever we stand regarding this question, lets resolve before God to grow up in our relationship with Him. Let's seek "the Blesser" and not just the blessings, God himself and not just His benefits. Because only when we do this does our life change, we will never be the same as before, also we will be able to partake in the wedding feast with our bridegroom when He comes in all glory.

Q. What inspired you to take this unique profession? What is the most memorable adventure God has taken you through in your work?

rowing up, I wanted to be a doctor and look after the sick and dying but God had other plans for me and I ended up looking after the dead! I also loved flowers and gardening, so after my graduation, I decided to follow my passion and undertook a specialised course in Floriculture to become a full-time gardener, growing various cut

flowers in Kohima. Later on, I joined the Horticulture Department, Nagaland as Technical Assistant and trained people on commercial floriculture. In 2008, I got the opportunity to work for the Commonwealth War Graves Commission as Manager of Guwahati War Cemetery and Digboi War Cemetery. It was a job I had dreamt of, as the Commission is known for high standard of horticulture maintenance in its cemeteries and memorials. I have always believed that pursuing anything you are passionate about will bring contentment in what you do. Today I am happy that God has helped turn my hobby into a profession!

In 2011, I was assigned with the task of renovating the WWI Graves in India, also called the India Cantonment Project, over a period of 5 years. The project was spread over 130+ sites all over India. Since the maintenances of these cemeteries were outsourced to local churches, I had the opportunity to work with more than 50 churches and their leaders. It was a mixture of both good and bad experiences but it did show me how in spite of various difficulties and prosecutions, there are church leaders who are working hard to spread the Gospel. But in all honesty, every day is memorable. I am blessed with opportunities every day, opportunities, which inspire and challenge me to grow for which I am constantly grateful to our greatest Enabler.



his year the NCF Delhi
Annual camp took place at
Christian Retreat and Study
Centre (CRSC) in Dehradun,
Uttarakhand from 2nd – 5th October on
the theme "Blessings 2017" based on
Psalm 5:12. There were 47 campers in

all including the four resource persons-Pastor Ricky, Aunty Viring, Jay Orvis and John Lucas. We boarded the bus on the night of 1st Oct and reached the campsite safely around 6:30 the next morning. The campers were divided into 5 groups-Love, Faith, Hope, Joy and Grace which are taken from the food of the spirit.

We begin our day with morning devotion at 7:30 am which is led by Pastor Ricky. The daily devotion sessions taught us how to begin our day with the Lord, the importance of meditation and application in our everyday Christian

life. It also taught us that a personal relationship with God is important and always ought to come first.

God used the resource persons to speak to us in different ways as we personally opened up our hearts and minds to hear His voice. Sometimes, the schedule was a little hectic but by the end of the camp, we realised it was all worth it. We ended our camp with a personal sharing around the camp fire. Personally, it was a blessing to witness everyone sharing their own insights and experiences about the camp.

Truly, the Lord has been our shield throughout the camp, protecting us and keeping us safe from all dangers and blessing us with good weather and good health. We are grateful for His mercy and we give glory to God for all of His blessings.
