#### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

ore than 2000 years ago, an extraordinary man walked this earth. He did not come from the privileged class nor from any political powerhouse. But wherever He went, He became the center of attention. Something about him set him apart from all other men. Those who witnessed his life said there was something about Jesus Christ which was completely different. And within 3 years of public ministry, he had changed the world and its effect has been felt for the next 20 centuries and still counting!

Unlike many famous personalities who have also walked this earth, Jesus' only credentials was himself. He never was a prolific or a popular writer like a Louise L'amour or a Jackie Rowlings; nor was he a great Commander like a General Patton or a Field Marshall Sam Maneckshaw! Never held a political position like an Abraham Lincoln or owned property like a Queen Elizabeth! He did not travel beyond a hundred miles of his village nor was he as educated as a Stephen Hawkings!

Yet his greatness was obvious to



all those who saw and heard him. And while most great and famous people eventually fade into history books, Jesus is still the focus of thousands of books and continues to draw unparalleled media attention. Many great and famous moral and religious figures including self-proclaimed God men have come, accomplished great things and then died and still remain in their grave. Jesus alone had declared that even after he dies and is buried, he would bodily rise again on

the third day. And in this season of Lent and particularly Passion Week leading to His crucifixion, the focus of whether or not Jesus rose from the dead is once again brought to the fore.

Josh McDowell, a former Agnostic who later became a leading Christian Apologist declared that the resurrection of Jesus Christ is one of the most wicked, vicious, heartless hoaxes ever foisted upon the minds of men if proven to be false. He therefore took it upon himself to research and write a legal paper that would examine the historical evidence of the Resurrection in order to disprove it. Instead he found overwhelming evidence to prove that it happened! His research paper culminated in his classic book The new evidence that demands a verdict.

There have been others who have made such attempts to prove the Resurrection never happened or have come up with intriguing conspiracy theories to disprove the Resurrection. The best-selling Novel <u>The Da Vinci Code</u> by Dan Brown is one such.

So, what are we to conclude regarding the various conspiracy theories about Jesus Christ?

#### SPIRITUALLY SPEAKING

Among others, Karen King, professor of ecclesiastical history at Harvard, though a strong advocate of Gnostic teaching concluded, "These notions about the conspiracy theory ... are all marginal ideas that have no historical basis." But in spite of the lack of historical evidence, conspiracy theories continue to thrive and can still arouse great interest and Good writers can still sell millions of books and successful Hollywood movies are produced as proven by Dan Brown.

On the other side of the spectrum there are several notable, historical and secular sources for the authenticity of the Resurrection. For instance, the Roman governor-historian Tacitus made a fascinating reference to Jesus when describing how Nero martyred 1st century Christians (in AD 65) as scapegoats for the burning of Rome. Here is what he said:

'Nero... punished with the most exquisite tortures, the persons commonly called Christians, who were hated for their enormities. Christus, the founder of the name, was put to death by Pontius Pilate, procurator of Judea in the reign of Tiberius; but the pernicious superstition, repressed for a time broke out again, not only through Judea, where the mischief originated, but through the city of Rome also' (Annals XV. 44)

Another historian, Josephus a Jewish military leader wrote and summarizes the history of the Jewish nation from its beginning up to his time.

'At this time there was a wise man...
Jesus... good, and... virtuous. And many people from among the Jews and the other nations became his disciples.
Pilate condemned Him to be crucified and to die. And those who had become his disciples did not abandon his discipleship. They reported that He had appeared to them three days after his crucifixion and that He was alive'... (Antiquities xviii. 33)

From these glimpses back into the past, it can be seen that the death and Resurrection of Christ was a known and discussed event soon after it had happened. In fact the issue reached a level where the Emperor of Rome felt he had to deal with it. The eyewitnesses to Jesus Christ actually spoke and acted like

they believed he physically rose from the dead after his crucifixion. If they were wrong then Christianity has been founded upon a lie. But if they were right, such a miracle would substantiate all Jesus said about God, himself, and us.

And we can declare and rejoice with Paul when he says:

"When the perishable has been clothed with the imperishable, and the mortal with immortality, then the saying that is written will come true: "Death has been swallowed up in victory.

"Where, O death, is your victory?

Where, O death, is your sting

The sting of death is sin, and the power of sin is the law. But thanks be to God! He gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ. Therefore, my dear brothers and sisters, stand firm. Let nothing move you. Always give yourselves fully to the work of the Lord, because you know that your labor in the Lord is not in vain." 1 Corinthians 15:54-58 (NIV)

his opportunity to share a little part of my journey with my family in NCFD is very special, and I hope to make this relevant and meaningful.

Those of you who know me know that my journey as a follower of Christ has been fragmented and bumpy. Born in a Christian family, I grew up inside the comfortable daily resonances of the Lord's prayer, Bible readings, Sunday school and hymns, and paid little heed to it all. When I was eight years old, I remember attending one of those mega-gatherings where there were thousands of people sitting inside a huge *shamiana* and there was an altar call. I think my mother was very startled when I got up and walked towards the enclosure, sat and prayed with an unfamiliar priest and gave my life to Christ.

It was a child's commitment and I don't recall my understanding becoming any deeper, other than the fact that I prayed often and loved to sing hymns. I was older, perhaps fifteen, at the time of my 'confirmation' ceremony, but then too my commitment remained immature, and I continued in this superficial state for many years.

The sudden death of my father brought the first crisis to my faith, and sadly I crumbled beneath it. For fifteen long years, I turned away from God and from the Church, making only face-saving appearances during Christmas and Easter, and even then refusing to partake in the Holy Communion.

In these fifteen years, I grew into an adult. I found my passion for human rights work, discovered my facility for the law, was pushed by my mentors to advance my knowledge and professional skills, and made many dear friends among the "left". It was during this time that I found what I believed to be "true love", got married and had a child. I moved to a small mountain village where I lived and worked for four years. It was all very cool indeed. From the outside, it looked like a very exciting life and even today there are friends who tell me about how envious they were of my "perfect" world, the adventures, the thrilling risks, and the romance of it all.

Those who knew me better knew there was trouble in paradise. Slowly my spirit was fading inside me and everyday; I struggled to keep up a façade of normality. I remember the terror I felt at times when my life force seeped out of me into the ground, a physical experience of slow and steady depletion. Slowly, I became a shadow of my former self. To protect myself, I surrounded myself with walls, becoming increasingly brittle even as those very walls shut out the people I loved and who loved me back.

A friend drew me back to Christ and to NCF, where I first began to get to know Christ as a grown woman. I remember slipping in and out of worship, silent as a shadow, closed behind my protective masks. It took many years before I opened up to others in NCF and allowed myself to be befriended.

Over the years I have learnt to look back at that woman that I once was with compassion and forgiveness, because 'she' was a very strange woman indeed. Walking inside her own personal cumulus nimbus, she made many, many mistakes. Relationships squandered, promises broken, harsh words spoken, opportunities lost, disobedience upon disobedience, and of course, a broken home.

But the Word of God promises us that God works all things for good of those who love Him, and who are called according to His purpose. A friend paraphrased this for me in words that have echoed inside the darkest places of my soul- out of the broken places, grace shines through.

Today I have so much to be grateful for, and sometimes I even become a little complacent about it all. But there is one thing that never ceases to amaze me. And that is how persistent and relentless and unwavering God's commitment to me has been. We are taught, and we believe, that it is our responsibility to make a commitment to God and to keep that commitment,

and for a greater part that is correct. But what I have found is that; there are times, indeed there are long stretches of times in our lives, when far from keeping the commitment we actively try to break it. God, being a thorough gentleman, does not force His will upon us at such times- we are free to go and make the mistakes and blunders we so arrogantly think we are entitled to. But even then He does not turn His back upon us.

Indeed, I look back at myriad examples of when I have been in horribly dangerous situations, when the distance between me and the abyss has been a fraction of a millimeter, and for reasons I am unable to explain, I have not plunged into that chasm. Perhaps He was holding me by the edge of my *dupatta* till I scrambled back to safety. These are times when I have neither been prayerful, nor respectful, nor indeed considered myself to be a Christian at all.

Maybe an example would be helpful. When my former husband proposed to me at the height of our courtship, I was so besotted that I would have agreed to anything. At least, that is what I thought. Yet when the discussions commenced regarding the marriage ceremony (he was not a Christian) I vehemently refused to convert in order to have a religious ceremony of his faith. I really don't know where that resolve came from, since I considered myself to be an agnostic at the time. I just remember the First Commandment going around my head, and thinking that I may have walked away from Christ, but I cannot bow down before another god, not even for love. That small refusal to surrender to what soon became a toxic relationship was at that time and place quite inexplicable. I remember being as confused by it as the rest of the family. Today I know it was God's way of holding on to me, of keeping a foothold inside my

heart which would one day become a pathway back into His presence. Of course, I see this only in retrospect.

Apart from keeping me safe from falling into the abyss, even as I chose again and again to go right to the very edge, I look back at a life that has been abundantly blessed and replete with serendipity. The wonderfully eccentric friendships, the journeys far and deep into the high mountains, the teachers who have shared so much of themselves with me, the children I have been blessed to watch growing, the colleagues and the work we have done together, my family in Christ in NCF and outside, the music, the writing, the laughter—there are times I feel like the richest woman in town! But what amazes me is that the seeds of this abundant life were sown during the years of darkness, the fifteen years I spent away from the Church and from Christ. This seems to be a paradox because the received wisdom is that, cutting

oneself off from God also means we cut ourselves off from His blessings. The only way I can explain this is that during those years, while I turned away from Him, He did not turn away from me.

The verse at the beginning of this piece has been a great source of strength and encouragement for me, particularly during the early years when I returned to the church. Those days were marked by rock bottom self-esteem, insecurity and uncertainty. During those years, when we would sing the hymn based upon these verses, I would feel an enfolding sense of calm, of confidence, of certainty that in my walk with God I do not have to rely on my own strength, which is so depleted. Because I know whom I have believed, I know that He holds on to me even when I don't hold on to Him. He indeed never lets me go.




