It is at times like these that made me realise how much power the sharing and encouraging of the word with a group of people who live on the everlasting hope matters.

Going back to Acts 1:14 we see that Jesus has just ascended, and no matter what, as humans, every disciple and follower of Christ must have gone through some hard times, but in the end having each other to share their burdens and lift them together to God through prayers has real transformational power that we as believers in Christ are privileged to have even in the present times.
